Lesson Goals

- Introduce Pathways of Change curriculum; establish routines and guidelines

- Social Awareness: Developing empathy, perspective-taking, and appreciating diverse experiences
- Relationship Skills: Social engagement and relationship building

- Big Wind Blows
- Connection Mural

Optimistic Closing & Assessment

- Cool down and regulating activities: Breathing and mindfulness skills
- Students share "One thing I learned today"
- Evaluator will be present at each lesson to utilize an observational rubric of content and process
- Qualitative information received verbally from students at the end of each session to assess retention of lesson content

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- Acknowledge and celebrate each student's unique strengths and abilities
- Explore and normalize similarities and differences in individuals and families and ways to demonstrate respect to others
- Use family-inclusive language and plan activities that apply to a range of student experiences and recognize *all* adults/caregivers in a child's life

Tips for Parents/Caregivers

- Spend time with your child identifying and honoring what makes them unique
- Help children understand the importance of acknowledging similarities and differences among individuals and families
- Discuss with your child that interacting with individuals from different cultures, experiences, or viewpoints adds value, interest, and perspective to their lives
